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Town Report Dedication



The town of Sidney has a rich history of agriculture. This year, the Select Board proudly dedicates the 2023 Annual Report to Sidney farmers past and present.

When Sidney was incorporated in 1792, it was noted that Sidney had a very good climate and rich soil close to the river that was conducive to growing grain and grass (hay) while the western side of the town was more conducive to growing fruit trees such as apple trees. Sidney has historically produced bountiful fruits of its farming families' hard work and perseverance.

A day in life of a late 18th century Sidney family consisted of being a “self-sufficient farm, with oxen, dairy cows, sheep, chickens, and steadily expanding fields that provided food for people and livestock. The second generation of inhabitants enjoyed the fruits of orchards planted by their fathers.”¹

Apples and hay were two of the biggest products farmed in Maine though there were chicken farms, cattle farms and more. “In 1876, the Bowman Brothers on the Middle Road ran the largest apple nursery in the county with 75,000 trees. Sidney’s most successful commercial orchard operation was Cleon Bartlett’s on Bartlett Road, with about 25 acres of apples trees. Peak harvests produced 15,000 – 18,000 bushels.”²

Additional noteworthy farmers of the past were: Luther and Bradford Sawtelle (cattle breeds), Rev. W.A.P. Dillingham (sheep),³ John Ernst (chickens), Evan Bragg, (hay),⁴ Paul Bailey, George Graves, John and Herbert Philbrick, Eugene Cowan, Lendall Goff, Harry Bickford, Fred Turner and Roy Bacon (apples).⁵

Over time, farming slowly changed from self-sufficiency farming and farmers began specializing in certain crops and animal husbandry. Apple and hay farmers would exchange their products for items produced by other Sidney farmers such as butter, eggs, dairy, chickens, and beef, etc.

Sidney farmers continue its rich history of farming with farms raising cattle for beef, goats for meat and cheese, dairy farming, maple products, horse breeding, alpaca fiber, beginning plantings and flowers.

The Select Board is proud of its Sidney farmers past and present. Without our farmers Sidney wouldn't be where it is today. So the next time you drive around town, just imagine what it was like at the peak time of farming and how much has changed. We should all be grateful to those still holding onto that rich heritage.

Dear Friends,

I've often thought that Maine is just one big small town connected by long roads. Well, in the past year or two, those roads have gotten steeper and bumpier as we dealt with an unprecedented pandemic and the resulting economic troubles.

As we faced the historic challenges, something impressive happened. We came together and lent a hand to our neighbors wherever we could to keep things running and spirits high.

Down in Washington, Congress tried to help Maine communities get through this struggle, so that our state would come out stronger. To do that, we put in the work and set some things into motion that are already helping Maine people. That's why you hired us, after all.

The pandemic made something we'd known for a while clear: those roads and networks that connect our big town needed repair, improvements, and expansion – from bridges to broadband. So, while Maine was uniting towards a common purpose, Congress came together to pass the *Bipartisan Infrastructure Law* – legislation that makes generational investments in physical infrastructure, broadband connections, harbors, and the energy grid. These efforts will lay the foundation for Maine's 21st century economy and make sure even the most rural areas aren't left behind.

Over the last two years, as we drove up and down our state, you couldn't help but see storefronts in trouble and prices rising as the economy struggled through a global recession. And again, while you focused your efforts on getting through the difficult times, Congress took meaningful action. We passed the *American Rescue Plan* in 2021, which enabled Governor Mills and the state of Maine to better meet the health and economic difficulties of the pandemic. At a critical moment it expanded healthcare efforts to confront COVID and invested in the state to keep the economy in far better shape than most others nationwide.

Congress didn't stop there. This year, we took even more concrete steps to cut costs, create jobs, and provide more affordable, cleaner energy. The bipartisan *CHIPS Act* will bring home the manufacturing of the technical components known as "chips" that are used in everything these days – from smartphones to microwaves to cars – and in doing so reduce prices and create good American jobs. We also passed the *Inflation Reduction Act (IRA)* to lower healthcare costs, allow Medicare to negotiate drug prices, and cut energy bills with new rebates for things like heat pumps and solar panels.

Beyond these major investments, we also passed vital legislation to improve the day-to-day lives of Maine people and Americans nationwide. On a bipartisan basis, we expanded health care for veterans exposed to toxins, strengthened protections for marriage equality, supported Ukraine as it fought off a bloody Russian invasion, secured our elections and the peaceful transfer of power, and delivered millions in federal investments to projects up and down our state.

So, as Maine worked to get through hard times, Congress took steps to support our state – and we're already starting to see brighter days ahead. I'm proud to have played a small part down here; it's a true privilege to listen to you, work with you, and build a brighter future for all the incredible people up and down the roads that connect our big small town. Mary and I wish you a happy, and safe 2023.

Dear Friends:

It is an honor to represent Maine in the U.S. Senate. I am grateful for the trust that Mainers have placed in me and welcome this opportunity to share some key accomplishments for our state.

Last year, I secured more than \$500 million for 285 projects from Aroostook County to York County that will promote job creation, workforce training, and economic development; expand access to health care; improve public safety, infrastructure, and community resources; and protect our environment. To address the crisis of soaring inflation and high energy prices, I led efforts to provide \$2 billion in supplemental funds to the Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program. In the new Congress that begins in 2023, I expect to be the Vice Chairman of the Appropriations Committee and will continue to champion investments to support Maine's communities and families.

Strengthening our economy and supporting good jobs remain a top priority. Along with the Governor and the rest of the Maine Delegation and the associations representing the lobster industry, I worked to protect our hardworking lobstermen and women by pausing for six years the onerous federal regulations that jeopardize our lobster fishery's very existence. Another ongoing threat to Maine's small businesses is the shortage of workers. That's why I led an effort to push the Administration to nearly double the number of H-2B visas that are critical to our hospitality industry. Additionally, when the Administration proposed to cut the construction of a destroyer to be built by Bath Iron Works, I restored this funding to protect Maine jobs and our national security.

When Maine Veterans' Homes announced last year that it planned to close its facilities in Caribou and Machias, I opposed that decision which would have had such a devastating effect on rural veterans and their families. I am glad that the decision was reversed, and I have secured \$3 million to help with upgrades to these facilities. My *AUTO for Vets Act* also became law, which will help disabled veterans maintain their independence by supporting the purchase of a new adaptive vehicle once a decade.

This past year, Congress demonstrated how effective it can be on behalf of the American people when both parties work together. A few of the bipartisan achievements that I was involved in include the *Respect for Marriage Act*, which will provide certainty to millions of loving couples in same-sex marriages while protecting religious liberties, and the *Electoral Count Reform Act*, which establishes clear guidelines for our system of certifying and counting electoral votes for President and Vice President.

No one works harder than the people of Maine, and I have honored that work ethic by showing up for every vote. During my Senate service, I have cast more than 8,500 consecutive votes, never having missed one. I remain committed to doing all that I can to address your community's concerns in 2023. Dear Friends,

I hope this letter finds you safe and well. It's an honor to continue serving as your representative in Congress, and I take the responsibility very seriously. I appreciate the opportunity to update you on what I've been working on behalf of the people of the Second Congressional District.

In August, I voted for the *Inflation Reduction Act* because it represented a dramatic turnaround from misguided efforts to pass sweeping, ill-designed legislation that tried to accomplish too many things through budget gimmicks, setting up problematic fiscal cliffs in numerous programs and refusing to make the difficult decisions to allow for a fiscally responsible bill.

The *Inflation Reduction Act*, which was signed into law by the president, was fiscally responsible and targeted four key priorities: reducing our national debt and putting our country back on a more sustainable path, lowering the cost of prescription drugs, and making health care more affordable, investing in an all-of-the-above energy strategy to significantly increase oil, gas, and renewable energy production to lower energy costs for Americans, and cracking down on the tax avoidance of billion-dollar multinational corporations. This bill was the first major legislation in the last decade to use the reconciliation process to create a fiscally responsible budget to reduce deficits. The Congressional Budget Office estimated it would reduce deficits by approximately \$300 billion.

As a member of the House Armed Services Committee, I also helped pass the Fiscal Year 2023 National Defense Authorization Act, which among other things, included key wins for Bath shipbuilders, UMaine, and servicemembers and their families. For shipbuilders, the bill secured authorization for a third DDG-51 destroyer; established a new contract for up to 15 DDG-51 destroyers over the next five years, many of which will be built at Bath Iron Works; and included funding for shipyard infrastructure. The bill also authorized over \$25 million for defense research programs, including UMaine's large-scale manufacturing program. Finally, the bill authorized a 4.6% pay increase to help servicemembers and their families deal with rising costs due to inflation.

Additionally, at the end of 2022, Congress passed a spending bill to fund the government through September of 2023. The bill funds nearly \$27 million in funding for community projects across the Second Congressional District, a lifeline for our lobster industry that freezes any regulatory action for at least six years, and secures millions in additional funding for the Low Income Housing Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) to help Mainers heat their homes.

Regardless of the year, one of my top priorities is ensuring I'm accessible to you. My staff and I can help answer questions about and navigate federal programs; find resources in Maine; and resolve issues with Medicare, Social Security, the VA, and other federal agencies and programs. As the town continues to grow, the Board remains committed to managing the demands of this growth and meeting the needs of the residents. As always, the Board will continue to do its best to keep the tax mil rate as low as possible.

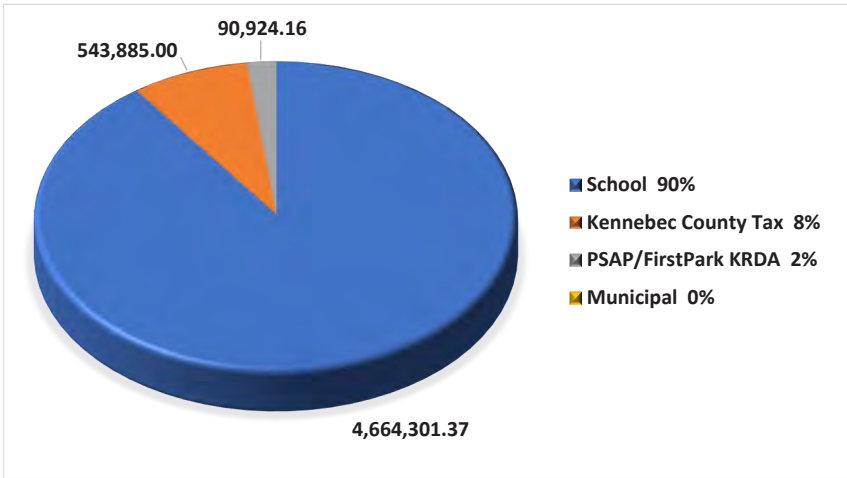

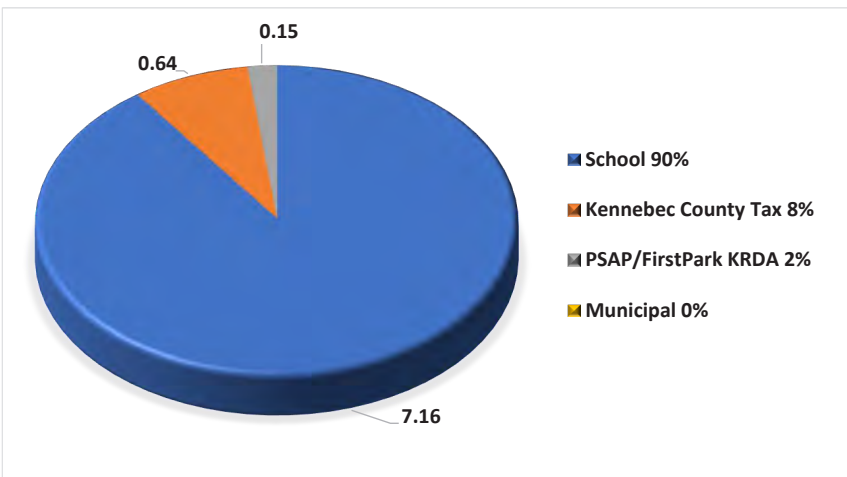

Report of the Code Enforcement Officer & Plumbing Inspector

Over the course of the year 2022, the Town of Sidney continued to experience new growth. There were 22 new single-family homes constructed, which is down from 2021, but also several new businesses and two solar farms were permitted. The chart below reflects the building permits issued during the calendar year 2022.

All the new single-family homes had internal plumbing and subsurface wastewater disposal permits (septic system) issued as part of their new developments. A total of 72 plumbing permits were issued—this includes both internal plumbing, and subsurface wastewater disposal systems. The three building permits labeled “other” included two solar farms and one steel warehouse that will be the home of Mainly Vending, LLC.

A total of three new ordinances have been drafted and are proposed for adoption by the Town. One ordinance pertains to Solar Farms, which seeks to establish a standardized set of rules and criteria for solar farms to meet. This ordinance has been proposed in an effort to react to the explosion of solar farm development both in the region and locally in the Town of Sidney. Several solar farms have been approved both last year and this year, with two new solar farms approved and permitted in 2022. This ordinance will give the Town financial assurance and protection, gives the Town more control, and establish standardized rules for these developments.

Another ordinance prohibits year-round occupancy of a Recreational Vehicle (RV). This ordinance seeks to establish a maximum length of occupancy in a RV (or any short term/temporary housing unit) to more easily address dangerous, unhealthful, and unsightly nuisance conditions that have arisen on several occasions. Whether it be the backlash from the COVID pandemic, the effects of inflation, or rising cost of living in general, we have seen a sharp increase in the number of people that are moving into a RV and using it as their dwelling. This is often done with no provision for waste disposal, trash storage and removal, inadequate heat source (or none in some cases), unsafe electrical supply (via extension cords from a house or via generator and extension cord) and do not comply with minimum fire code requirements for a single-family home.

The last ordinance proposed pertains to trash and rubbish storage. Over the past couple of years, I have had to address several residential properties that had a significant accumulation of improperly stored trash on the premises. This is not only a nuisance to nearby properties, but can create unhealthful environments, pollutes the environment, jeopardizes drinking water supplies, and contributes significantly to the harborage of rodents and other wild animals. The proposed ordinance requires trash and rubbish to be stored in an approved watertight trash container with a lid (or within an approved structure) between collection periods.

Thanks for a great year, looking forward to another busy and productive year in the Town of Sidney.

The members of the Sidney Fire Department have completed another year of dedication to the Town of Sidney. Their commitment to respond to emergencies of all hours of the day and night should give the residents comfort in knowing that they are protected during these challenging years after COVID.

Over the past year the Sidney Fire Department responded to many fire calls and assisted our mutual aid towns. We also assisted Sidney Rescue with calls when they needed an extra hand. In order to respond to the many emergencies that we have in town, including the interstate, our fire fighters train several hours throughout the year. As Chief, I know that we are well prepared to encounter any emergency situation that we may be called to.

Last year we received a grant to purchase P-25 digital portable radios and mobiles with minimal cost to the town. These radios will bring us closer to compliance when the State transitions to full digital communications.

Like most fire departments throughout the USA, we are faced with increased budgets and a decrease in firefighters. With the number of calls and severity that are received today our mutual aid towns recognize the great need for their assistance. At this time the Sidney Fire Department would like to thank the following mutual aid departments - Oakland, Belgrade, Rome, Smithfield, Augusta, Waterville, and Winslow Fire Departments.

During the year we had two members, CJ Sudsbury and Adam Bickford, finish the Firefighter 1&2 program. Over 120 hours of training was required in order to be certified in all areas. Some of the training that they accomplished was, SCBA to be interior, hazmat, ladders, ropes, extrication, car fires, and live controlled fires in a structure. Please take the time if you see these two individuals to congratulate them on this very big accomplishment. I would like to thank their families for enabling them to complete this task as they are both a great asset to the department.

The Sidney Fire Department is very proud to announce that we were accepted into the SHAPE program through the Bureau of Labor. We endured a nearly nine-hour inspection from the State to check on our compliance to Maine standards. Due to the excellence results of the inspection, we were fast tracked into the program. A lot of time, training, and paperwork went into this and as a result helped save us money on worker's comp insurance.

At this time the Sidney Fire Department would like to thank everyone in town for their continued support to the department. Without your continued support it would be difficult for us to do our job.

7 Lakes Alliance Annual Report

7 Lakes Alliance thanks Sidney voters for approving Town funding that supports conservation work in the Belgrade Lakes region. Sidney's support is critical to successfully addressing erosion control and the prevention and remediation of invasive plants such as milfoil. 7 Lakes maximizes Sidney's support by leveraging funding from other sources, including the state. Investing in lakes is smart – a clean lake supports Sidney's tax base (reducing tax levies for taxpayers who do not own lakefront property), local jobs and the region's economy.

Highlights of 7 Lakes Alliance's work in 2022 include:

- 18 Adopt-a-Shoreline and Invasive Plant ID workshops in three locations.
- 50 new Adopt-a-Shoreline volunteers and 16 miles of shoreline adopted.
- 3 invasive plant paddles in search of new infestations. None were found.
- 5 trainings for courtesy boat inspectors. (All of the above increased over 2021.)
- 6,228 courtesy boat inspections with 0 invasive plant fragments introduced.
- Successful herbicide treatment of 19 acres of milfoil in Great Meadow Stream and Great Pond. 7 Lakes supported Maine Department of Environmental Protection in that effort.
- Successful containment of curly-leaf pondweed in 13 acres of the Serpentine and Old Mill Stream.
- 15 Youth Conservation Corps members built almost 100 best practices for controlling erosion on 50 properties across the watershed.
- \$308,650 secured in Clean Water Act grants, resulting in infrastructure improvements that will total approximately \$600,000, including 7 miles of gravel roads and driveways. Another \$224,434 in grants have been secured for 2023.
- More than 1,000 water samples were collected, tested and analyzed from all seven lakes.

Without the support of our municipal partners, some of this work could not have happened. For example, courtesy boat inspection expenses in 2021 were \$90,513. Of that, lake associations contributed \$63,264 and the State of Maine \$21,800. Towns and private donors provided the \$5,449 balance.

Town funds also support the work of the Youth Conservation Corps, which serves shoreline properties across the Belgrade Lakes watershed's 180 square miles. Along with remedying erosion concerns, the YCC provided summer jobs for 15 high school and college students. The Town's financial support of the YCC helps leverage diverse funding partnerships that protect the ecological, recreational, economic and cultural values of our community's most precious natural resource – the lakes.

Dams Committee 2022 Annual Report and 2023 Budget Request

To the Towns of **Belgrade, Mt. Vernon, Oakland, Rome and Sidney**
Members of inter-local agreement for management of Belgrade area dams

Mother Nature was good to us this past year, giving us just enough rain to maintain the water level management plan we are charged with implementing. The four Belgrade area lakes under the auspices of the Dams Committee are now at normal winter water storage levels as we look forward to spring ice out.

Normal maintenance and repairs were successfully conducted on all three dams this past year in addition to successful completion of Salmon Lake's Dam gate replacement steel plating, new seals, a valve to accurately measure the mandated 1cfs and an automated data logger to record daily water levels.

For 2023, in addition to \$20,000 for the continuing preventive maintenance and repairs on all three dams, the Dams Committee is requesting an additional \$124,087 for concrete remediation, security fencing and painting at the Village Dam, driveway work at the Wings Mill site, and continuance of the \$15,000 capital reserve account to help offset future large project expenditures. The detail of the 2023 budget request is below:

The Sidney Food Pantry is client choice. We allow our clients the opportunity to select their own food much like they would in a grocery store. This allows clients the chance to choose from a variety of foods to meet their own personal dietary needs and tastes. Visiting a food pantry can be a humbling experience for many. Having access to a variety of foods and the ability to select which foods one wants for their family not only makes the system equitable and reduces waste but empowers people to make their own decisions and restores integrity to the process of receiving much needed food.

It's totally understandable that people who need to ask for food from a local food pantry can feel ashamed or embarrassed. Which is why our food pantry volunteers can make it easier. It's important to create an atmosphere of love and dignity. Pantry goers need all the support they can get when they are going through tough times.

Pantry goers could be you or me: We may think that only the unemployed or homeless use food pantries, but that simply isn't true. This year we will celebrate the 35th anniversary of the Kennebec Land Trust (KLT). With generous support from community members, we have worked to conserve important lands; provide public access for hiking, paddling, skiing, blueberry picking, and hunting; and promote land stewardship, conservation education, and partnerships.

KLT has an impressive list of accomplishments: 100 properties, with 7,584 acres under permanent conservation throughout our 413,000-acre service area; 57 miles of trails to explore; over 20 miles of conserved shoreline; and 1,100 household and business partner members.

As we look to the future, we will continue to conserve high value land and protect important wildlife habitat, and we're also offering programs to promote and expand conservation in ways that better serve our communities.

KLT offers a great selection of outings and educational programs for the public, and we collaborate with schools and other organizations to engage youth and share our conservation message with the community. The Sidney Highway Department has included information for the correct installation and maintenance of mailboxes along roadways. As in the past we continue to include the Town of Sidney's Mailbox Policy for Sidney Roads in this Annual Report. Please find the mailbox information following this notice.

Snow in Roadways

The Sidney Highway Department would like all property owners to be aware of the safety and legal issues of putting snow in roadways and covering culverts. Due to many issues we encountered during the winter, we are sharing the following information released by the Maine Department of Transportation and Marc Guimont (MDOT's Director of Maintenance and Operations), December 1997:

“PUTTING SNOW IN ROADWAY IS ILLEGAL AND UNSAFE”

“As you are clearing your driveway after the next snowstorm, the Maine Department of Transportation wants you to remember that it's unsafe and illegal to dump the snow into the road for the State or local snowplow to move for you.”

Despite State statute found in 29A MRSA § 2396, “State and municipal snowplows routinely encounter situations where someone has plowed, snow blown, or even shoveled snow from a driveway into the road instead of disposing of it safely and properly.”

“The law making those actions illegal was passed to protect the driving public. Drivers encountering snow plowed from a driveway onto an otherwise clear or lightly-covered roadway stand a good chance of losing control of their vehicles when they hit the accumulated snow. Snow pushed, blown or thrown from a driveway could lead to an accident that puts someone in the hospital, or worse.”

State and municipal departments have the option of asking for State and local police assistance if they are constantly dealing with snow deposited into the roadway and over culverts. However, we would rather remind people about the serious problem that this causes before an accident occurs. Therefore, as you clean snow from your driveway, please be sure to remove any snow pushed into the roadway and please do not plow over the end of culverts. Thank you for your cooperation.

Town of Sidney Mailbox Policy for Sidney Roads

Adopted by the Board of Selectmen February 23, 2015

For convenience and practicality, mailbox installations have been allowed within the right-of-way of Sidney's roads; however it is important to recognize that such installations have two very important conditions:

- The mailbox must be installed in accordance with applicable standards to ensure that mail can be delivered and that the mailbox does not create an obstacle or safety hazard to those that use or maintain the highway, and
- The mailbox is installed entirely at the owner's risk. In other words, if the mailbox incurs damage during any sort of highway operations or maintenance, the property owner is not entitled to replacement or compensation. In fact, if the mailbox was not installed in accordance with the applicable standards as stated above, the owner may even be held liable for injuries or damages that may have been incurred as a result.

Mailbox Design

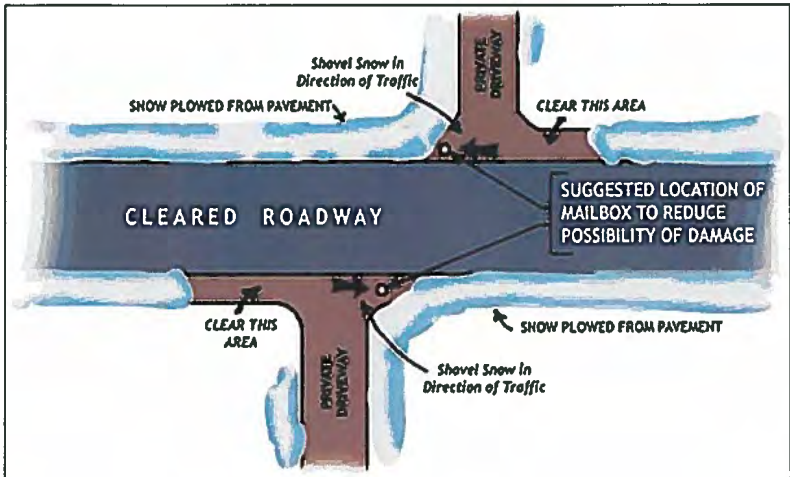
Mailbox design and installation standards are available from several sources, and mailbox owners are expected to consult this information prior to undertaking any mailbox installation or replacement. The following standards have nationwide relevance and were developed in cooperation with one another:

- The United States Postal Service (USPS) Mailbox Guidelines. The USPS defines the standards for mailbox construction, as well as the placement tolerance that must be met to accommodate postal operations. Specifics may be obtained from the local post office or online at: <https://www.usps.com/manage/know-mailbox-guidelines.htm>
- American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO) Roadside Design Guide. The AASHTO Roadside Design Guide, Chapter 11: *Erecting Mailboxes on Streets and Highways* deals with the safety and construction of privately owned mailboxes, mailbox supports, and mailbox turnout designs and is less focused on postal operations. This publication may be obtained online through the AASHTO Bookstore at: https://bookstore.transportation.org/Item_details.aspx?id=1807

The Town of Sidney has developed this policy to promote compliance with these national standards and to help further clarify the expectations and responsibilities of Sidney mailbox owners to improve the safety of our roads and highways. The following pages further specify the details associated with the mailbox height, location, offset, and post type to minimize the potential hazards associated with mailbox installations and to reduce the opportunities for damage to mailboxes.

Mailbox Installation Standards

- **General Location:** Whenever possible, mailboxes should be located after the driveway opening. This location placement improves visibility, minimizes the amount of snow that comes off of the snow plow, and improves the approach for the mail carrier. The diagram below further clarifies this preferred placement:



- **Mailbox Support Design:** It is best to use an extended arm type of post with a free-swinging suspended mailbox. This allows snowplows to sweep near or under boxes without damage to supports and provides easy access to the boxes by carrier and customers. The following picture shows a free-swinging suspended mailbox:



- **Offset:** Mailboxes should be set back from the edge of the shoulder – regardless of whether the shoulder is gravel or paved. In other words, the face of the mailbox should be at least **one foot (1') back from the edge of the normally plowed surface** of the highway or the face of curb. Greater offset distances are encouraged whenever possible to allow the mail carrier to get further out of traffic and to further minimize potential damage to the mailbox. The following picture shows a mailbox with a reasonable offset:



- **Height:** According to USPS standards, a mailbox must be installed with the bottom of the mailbox located between 41” and 45” high above the surface of the highway shoulder. The Sidney Public Works Director recommends that this height be closer to the 45” measurement to minimize conflict with the height of the plow truck wing when snow is being pushed back during, or between, winter storms. The following picture further clarifies the height considerations:



- **Post Size, Type and Embedment:** Mailbox posts must be sturdy enough to hold up the mailbox in all types of weather conditions, however they cannot be so rugged that they present a hazard to vehicles that inadvertently leave the road. If a mailbox support is struck by a vehicle, it must easily break away. Therefore, the following types of posts are deemed acceptable:
 - **4" x 4" wooden posts embedded 2 feet into the ground.** Larger wooden posts may be used only if the post is drilled through with an appropriate spade bit to create a shear plane that is no higher than 6" above the surface of the surrounding ground. The number and size of the drilled holes depends upon what is necessary to bring the cross-section of the larger post down to the equivalent cross-sectional area of a standard 4" x 4" post. (MaineDOT Standard Specification 606.06)
 - **1" to 2" round diameter steel or aluminum pipe or standard U-channel post embedded 2 feet into the ground.**
 - Unacceptable mailbox supports include: anything that is filled with concrete, masonry and stone structures, heavy steel structures, and most objects that were intended for other uses (e.g. antique plows, I-beams, and various other household tools and objects).

NOTICE: Mailboxes, attachments or support systems not consistent with this policy are considered "Deadly Fixed Objects" (also known as "DFOs") and are in violation of 23 MRSA §1401-A. As such, when these installations are recognized by the Sidney Road Commissioners, the owner will be informed of the hazard and immediate removal will be requested. If the property owner does not comply with this request, the Sidney Road Commissioners may elect to have the installation removed and seek reimbursement from the property owner for all costs incurred.

This "Mailbox Policy for Sidney Roads " is hereby adopted by the Sidney Board of Selectmen to be effective immediately upon signing and will remain in effect until revoked or amended.

It is an honor to serve as the Superintendent of Schools for RSU 18, and to have the chance to contribute to your town report. Throughout the year the district has been publishing our monthly “proud moments,” a document that brags about the impressive things happening in all eight of our schools. As we start a new year, I like to go back and reflect on these documents. There are trends that we should be proud of.

Parent and community involvement was everywhere. Events such as:

- Math and literacy parent events, where parents of our elementary students come into the school to read with or learn math games with their kids.
- Specific events that celebrate our freedoms by bringing in local veterans to be honored.
- Community awareness events that teach both civics and respect for community members.
- Lunch with a professional day, where community members come into school to meet with high school students to help students learn about different careers.

These were just a few of the many events I read about; but it was clear across the district that getting our community and parents back into the schools was a priority, well done.

Another trend I noticed was our district’s commitment to wellness. There are of course the typical events to highlight, such as our dental health program for our students, the screenings done by our nurses, and our dedication to the mental health of students and staff. This includes our greenhouses, the new courtyard and outdoor classroom at the high school and spaces at all schools to help get the students outside learning. I hope everyone has noticed the extensive work being completed to improve our facilities. Improved classroom spaces, additional educational resources, roof repairs, improved ventilation, new windows, updated sprinkler systems, upgraded transportation garage, improved traffic patterns, outdoor classrooms, improvements to our auditorium and athletic facilities, and the list goes on. This summer we have several projects scheduled to continue our commitment to safety and improved educational facilities. First and foremost, these improvements will make our schools safer and more comfortable for staff and students. The Kennebec County Sheriff's Office is pleased to make the following report regarding the services we provided to the people of Kennebec County in 2022. These services include the Law Enforcement Division, Correctional Services, Civil Process, Court and Transport Division. We provided many regional assets to our communities including K-9 Teams, Dive Team, Sex Offender Registry, Veterans Advocacy, Accident Reconstruction and Drug Recognition Experts (DRE) and a School Resource Officer for MSAD 49.

While the severity of the pandemic is decreasing, my office shall remain vigilant. We will monitor for potential virus recurrence in our correctional facility and take all recommended precautions to reduce any impact that may threaten those in our custody.

In 2022, Law Enforcement Deputies again logged thousands of calls for service. Our calls for service have increased since 2021. Our geographic patrol responsibilities within the County have increased, as the state police have opted to reduce their rural patrol coverage.

Overdoses of prescribed medications or illicit substances continue to plague our country. My staff responded to 20 overdoses in 2022, we were able to save 11 lives. This number does not include the saves by jail staff in 2022. As the disorder continues to increase, I wish to make it clear that we at the Sheriff's Office will always support our citizens with substance dependency disorders by providing avenues that can assist with their recovery.

The patrol division welcomes Sean Dixon and Eric Thiess to our team. Deputy Dixon has 12 years of full-time experience working as a law enforcement officer. Deputy Thiess came to us from our correctional division. Deputy Thiess is currently at the Maine Criminal Justice Academy attending the 18-week program to become a certified law enforcement officer.

My agency continues to receive federal funds to conduct patrol details specifically related to motor vehicle violations throughout the county. Kennebec County Deputies continue to excel statistically for the number of interdictions for drug related criminal activities.

Through the federal grants system, we were able to purchase a Can-Am UTV and trailer to assist us with our duties serving all of Kennebec County. This tool is available to any municipality or law enforcement agency within the county.

Our Civil Process Deputies serve legal documents on behalf of attorneys, the courts, citizens, local, and state government, landlords and other entities. In 2022, the three civil deputies received over 7,441 requests for service in Kennebec County. This is an increase from 2021 by over 300 services. Some of the services include civil summons & complaints, foreclosures, evictions, small claims, child support notices from the State and enforcement of court orders and writs to name a few.

We welcome any questions regarding civil service to be made to the office. Kennebec is very lucky to have Chief Civil Deputy Harry McKenney, who just happens to be the go-to guy on civil service matters statewide. Keep up good work Chief!

During the past year, our Correctional Facility managed 1810 inmate intakes. This is an increase from 2022. The offenses committed by defendants included everything from Trespass to Homicide.

Substance abuse and the proper treatment of citizens with mental illness continue to be two primary concerns at the Correctional Facility. We have improved our medical and mental health services at Kennebec to help manage the needs of those incarcerated.

Inmates at the Kennebec County Correctional Facility are asked to work and earn time off their sentences if applicable. Inmates who are a risk to the community work inside the facility cleaning and cooking, while others are supervised on outside projects. One may think that this only benefits the county, or our local municipalities, but it does not. It also benefits the inmate population as well.

We are committed to providing innovative programs to reduce crimes, assist victims, and to provide enhanced public safety. We acknowledge the ever-growing opiate addiction problem nationwide and have committed to partnerships at the Federal, State and Local levels to combat this problem. Our approach is aggressive enforcement, education, treatment and recovery for those afflicted with this horrible addiction.

The big news for my staff in 2022 was the purchase of 73 Winthrop Street in Augusta. This building will house the entire sheriff's office divisions which include administration, patrol, detectives and the civil division. Our mailing address will remain the same. More information on the move to follow within the next couple of months. Me and my staff are very excited to move into a larger and much newer building that we can call our own.

As your Sheriff, and moving forward into 2023, I remain committed to serving the hard-working taxpayers of this county, their families and our visitors, honorably, professionally, and by using good common sense and judgement.

Greetings:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Sidney, qualified by law to vote in Town affairs, to assemble at the Sidney Town Office, Friday the 24th of March A.D., 2023 at 12:15 P.M., Eastern Daylight Time to vote on Articles One and Two. Then the meeting will recess until 9:00 A.M., Eastern Daylight Time, Saturday, the 25th of March A.D., 2023, at which time it will proceed to vote on the remaining articles at the James H. Bean School, to wit:

ARTICLE 1: To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

ARTICLE 2: To choose by ballot the following officers for the ensuing year in accordance with M.R.S.A. 30, Sec. 2061, thereto wit:

one Selectman, Assessor, Overseer of the Poor to serve for a three-year term and one Selectman, Assessor, Overseer of the Poor to serve for a two-year term.

The polls or ballot box for receiving ballots for the above-mentioned officers will be open at 12:30 P.M., Eastern Daylight Time and will close at 8:00 P.M., Eastern Daylight Time.

ARTICLE 3: To see if the Town will vote to set September 1, 2023 as the due date for payment of 2023 taxes with interest on unpaid balances beginning October 1st, 2023 at 8%. 2022 due date was September 1st, 2022 with 4% interest charged October 1st, 2022.

ARTICLE 4: To see if the Town will vote to fix an amount of interest to be paid by the Town on abated taxes that have been paid for the fiscal year 2023-2024.

Current rate fixed by the Town is 4%.

ARTICLE 5: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Tax Collector to accept pre-payment of taxes for 2023, not yet assessed and to pay interest at a rate of ____% (not to exceed 4%) on such pre-payment made prior to commitment of those taxes. Interest was voted at 0% in 2022.

ARTICLE 6: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to expend overlay money to pay tax abatements and applicable interest granted during this fiscal year.

ARTICLE 7: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to spend an amount not to exceed 1/6 of the budgeted amount in each category of the 2023 annual budget during the period from February 1, 2023 to the year 2024 annual Town Meeting.

ARTICLE 8: To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to transfer monies received from excise tax to the surplus account at the close of the 2023-2024 fiscal year.







Definitions of Terms

The following are definitions of terms are used in this manual:

- 1. Abatement:** A reduction of assessed property taxes, if it is deemed that an error was made in the original assessment of the said property.
- 2. Accrual:** This is money that was appropriated at Town Meeting for a specific expense or project that is not completed before the end of the year. Money left over is carried forward to finish the project in the next fiscal year.
- 3. Block Grant:** Is funds received from the State to compensate towns for winter plowing of State roads.
- 4. Borrow:** A loan to fund large ticket capital improvement items such as vehicles, new buildings or improvements to existing buildings, etc.
- 5. Contingency Fund:** Money that can be used only for unbudgeted emergency use.
- 6. Escrow / Reserve:** Money that was approved to be set aside for future use for a specific item or purpose. Voters must approve the use of escrow money.
- 7. Overlay:** Monies that are appropriated at commitment time to cover errors in property assessments through an abatement process. Overlay amounts are determined by a formula set up by the State.
- 8. Raise:** Funds that are appropriated through the mil rate, to fund expenses such as education, County, overlay, the Kennebec Regional Development Authority and items voted on at the Town Meeting that are not appropriated through the surplus.
- 9. Receipts:** Income received, such as interest or donations that can be utilized to cover a shortage in a specific account. If not used, it will be placed into the reserve account for that department or will be rolled over into surplus.
- 10. Surplus / General Fund:** Money left over at the end of the Fiscal Year. It consists of collected excise tax, fees, undesignated receipts, and unexpended money. Surplus reduces the amount money to be raised to cover the approved budget. Rather than using projected receipts like the State of Maine and other municipalities, we use only collected receipts to help keep our budget in check.
