Dear Town of Sidney:

As the new session of Congress began, I was honored to become the longest, currently serving member of the U.S. Senate to have never missed a roll call vote. As the 111th Congress ended, I cast my 4,563rd consecutive vote. It is a privilege to represent you in Washington, D.C. and I appreciate this opportunity to share some of my recent work as we look forward to the opportunities and challenges that lie ahead in the 112th Congress.

Creating jobs and strengthening our economy remain our nation's most pressing challenges. Far too many families and individuals throughout Maine and our nation are still suffering from a sluggish economy and high unemployment. That is why it was so vital for Congress to extend the 2001 and 2003 tax relief laws. I strongly supported a two-year extension because allowing these laws to expire would have resulted in one of the largest tax increases in our nation's history, and job killing tax hikes could well have plunged our economy deeper into recession.

Last year, I spoke to small business owners throughout Maine who told me that a tax increase could result in a loss of jobs and threaten the viability of their businesses. It is good news that Congress passed the two-year extension of these tax relief laws before 2010 came to a close, providing more certainty to businesses and relief for all taxpayers.

After years of repeated but unsuccessful attempts by the Maine delegation to address the federal truck weights law, I authored a successful truck weights pilot program in 2009 that was in effect for one year. The pilot program permitted trucks weighing up to 100,000 pounds to travel on Maine's federal interstates, where these trucks belong, rather than being diverted to secondary roads, through small communities, downtown areas, and school zones. The benefits have been evident: improved safety, lower costs, reduced energy use, and reduced emissions. I was disappointed that the U.S. House of Representatives failed to take action either to extend the pilot program or to make it permanent. Making the truck weights program permanent will be one of my top priorities this year and will be the first bill I introduce in the new Congress.

The President signed into law a number of bills that I authored or coauthored. I was proud to join Senator Joe Lieberman in leading the effort to repeal the so-called "Don't Ask, Don't Tell" law that applied to our armed forces. This long-overdue repeal enables the U.S. to join 35 of our closest allies in welcoming the military service of any qualified individual who is willing and capable of serving our country.

My efforts to counter the smuggling of illegal drugs across the Canadian border into Maine, and vice versa, were advanced when the President signed the "Northern Border Counternarcotics Strategy Act." I was the lead Republican sponsor of this law, which requires the Office of National Drug Control Policy to develop a counternarcotics strategy similar to that of the Southwestern border in collaboration with our Canadian partners. The Senate Homeland Security Committee also conducted an extensive investigation into the Fort Hood terrorist attack. We will soon release a report with recommendations on how to reduce the possibility of such an attack in the future.

Former Senator Evan Bayh and I authored a new law that establishes a new Advisory Council to develop a national plan for combating Alzheimer's disease. For the first time, this law charges federal agencies to develop a strategy to advance efforts to fight this devastating disease, at no additional cost to taxpayers. As far too many people know, Alzheimer's disease inflicts pain and hardship on families, and costs Medicare and Medicaid billions, yet our nation has been lacking a national strategy to focus on this disease.

Maine's natural resource industries are essential to our prosperity. Last October, along with other Delegation members, I testified at an International Trade Commission hearing that resulted in a ruling that Chinese and Indonesian paper companies had been engaging in illegal trade that is unfair to our domestic industry. During the debate on the Food Safety Modernization Act, I successfully advocated for an amendment, backed by Maine's small and organic farmers, to protect our small farms from excessive regulation.

In my ongoing efforts to save jobs in Maine, I succeeded in convincing the EPA to rework regulations known as "boiler MACT" in a manner that protects the environment and public health without jeopardizing jobs in the forest products industry. I also authored successful legislation to provide small contractors more time to comply with EPA lead-based paint regulations. The high fines for non-compliance would have put many small contractors in Maine out of business.

Working with the University of Maine, I helped advance the development of deep water, off-shore wind energy. Last summer, Energy Secretary Steven Chu visited UMaine at my request, which resulted in an announcement that the Department would dedicate \$20 million to develop and test deepwater offshore wind technologies. UMaine remains on the cutting edge of this work, which has the potential to create 15,000 jobs.

I secured funding for a number of important transportation projects in 2010. For example, following my request, U.S. Transportation Secretary Ray LaHood announced that the Department would award \$10.5 million for Maine's effort to save freight railroad service in Northern Maine, and \$20 million for the rehabilitation of the Memorial Bridge between Kittery and Portsmouth.

As a member of the Senate Armed Services Committee, I worked to ensure that our men and women in uniform have the resources and support they need to protect our freedom. In 2010, I supported efforts to improve health care and other services for our military personnel and veterans, and authored key provisions to strengthen our national defense by supporting the vital work at Bath Iron Works, the Portsmouth Naval Shipyard, Pratt & Whitney, the Maine Military Authority, and other Maine industries. Following my letter last year to the President's top budget official urging him to include increased funding for the DDG-51 program in next year's budget, Defense Secretary Gates recently announced that the Pentagon would seek an additional DDG-51 in its five-year budget.

The 112th Congress will bring extraordinary challenges as we work to improve the economy, lower the unemployment rate, seek ways to reduce federal spending to bring the federal debt under control, and debate a host of other important issues. I am grateful for the opportunity to serve Sidney and Maine in the United States Senate. I'm proud to live in a state where individuals work so hard to sustain their communities.

We hold town meetings where neighbors can find compromise amid their disagreements, while still being able to say hello the next morning at the corner store. We help our neighbors through tough times by sending care packages to overseas troops, donating to local food pantries, and raising money for sick members of the community. And we work with each other to make the most out of bad situations.

SELECTMEN'S REPORT

This past year has been very busy and productive. During our meetings we have focused heavily on cost savings measures, energy usage, and heating costs. We have implemented some new changes to our accounting and monitoring systems and have made improvements to Town owned properties to increase their energy efficiency. Making the best use of our Town funds in these hard economic times continues to be our goal.

Another area we have addressed has been road safety. We have had the opportunity to meet with several residents who have expressed concerns regarding vehicle speed on our roadways. This presents a very dangerous situation. We strongly encourage all of our citizens to follow the posted speed limits on the roadways and, more specifically, to use caution when driving during adverse weather conditions. Please be mindful of our plow drivers by allowing them enough room on the roadways. Such efforts will help to achieve the task of keeping Sidney's traveled ways clear and safe for everyone.

During the past year, road infrastructure was a dominant topic of discussion. The cost of maintaining the Town roads is one of our biggest annual expenses. This year we were able to pave a portion of several town roads, provide surface repairs in several areas where culverts were replaced and make small repairs where needed. We will continue to make improvements; although currently, we are behind schedule by roughly \$100,000 necessary to complete our five-year road plan recommended by Cole Engineering. We are faced with many challenges as revenue has decreased from past years. We will continue to work diligently with the Road Committee toward the goal of keeping our roads safe.

There are no major capital improvements projects or purchases slated for this year's budget. Instead, along with recommendations from several of the Sidney Boards and Departments, the Selectmen are asking voters to approve funds to establish escrow accounts to reduce the financial impact of future capital expenditures in order

to avoid large increases in the Town's mil rate. The articles in this year's warrant seek funds that will only be used for future expenses with specific voter approval.

The Board of Selectmen would like to recognize all of our Town employees for their dedicated service. Further, we commend Leon Burgess who was promoted to the position of Road Foreman, as well as, extend our appreciation and best wishes to Kathleen Ross, formerly our Animal Control Officer, who has taken on a similar position with the City of Augusta. REPORT OF THE ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICER

I would first like to thank everyone for their warm welcome to Town of Sidney. Since my start as Sidney's Animal Control Officer in January, I have met many friendly faces.

As some of you may not know, I came to Maine in August of 2009 from California. For five years I worked as an Animal Control Officer for the Pasadena Humane Society and S.P.C.A. That's where I met my wife, who currently works for the Kennebec Valley Humane Society. Soon after we met, we wedded and had a baby. We then moved to my wife's home town of Augusta, where we are now raising our daughter.

As your Animal Control Officer, I will do my best to meet your needs as it pertains to domestic animal issues. If any town resident has any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to call. If I don't answer, please leave a message as I may be handling other animal issues. I look forward to meeting and assisting you with any questions or problems.

Remember to keep your pet up to date on its' vaccinations and licenses. It not only benefits your pet, but you as well. By doing this, you are in part helping to keep the spread of Rabies and other infections down. Rabies is an issue here in Maine, so lets work together to fight this.

What is rabies?

Rabies is a disease that is caused by a virus. It affects the brain and spinal cord and can cause death if left untreated. Rabies in people is very rare in the United States, but rabies in animals - especially wildlife - is common in most parts of the country including Maine. An animal with rabies is called a "rabid" animal.

How is rabies spread?

The rabies virus lives in the saliva, brain and spinal cord (neural tissue) of infected animals. It is spread when a rabid animal bites or scratches a person or animal, or if a rabid animal's saliva or neural tissue comes in contact with a person or animal's mouth, nose or eyes, or enters a cut in the skin. Rabies is not spread by petting or touching dried saliva, blood, urine, or feces of a rabid animal.

What animals can carry rabies?

In Maine, the most commonly infected animals are skunks, raccoons, bats, and foxes. Rabies can infect any animal that has hair, but is very rare among small rodents like squirrels, rats, mice, and chipmunks. Bat exposures are often difficult to detect, especially in the cases of a sleeping person awakening to a bat in the room or an adult witnessing a bat in a room with a previously unattended child, mentally disabled person, or intoxicated person.

What is a rabies exposure?

A rabies exposure happens when the saliva or neural tissue of a rabid animal comes in contact with a person or animal through a bite or scratch, cut in the skin, or gets into the eyes, nose, or mouth.

How can I prevent exposure to rabies?

Generally, you can avoid contact with wild animals. Also, make sure your dog or

cat is up-to-date on rabies vaccination.

What to do if...

You have been exposed to a ...

- *Domestic animal* (cat or dog)
 - Clean all wounds with soap and water for 10-15 minutes.
 - Call your local Animal Control Officer.
 - Call your Healthcare Provider.
 - Call your local Animal Control Officer
 - The cat or dog will likely require a 10 day quarantine to rule out rabies.
- *Wild animal* (raccoon, skunk, bat, fox, or other wild animal)
 - Clean all wounds with soap and water for 10-15 minutes.
 - Call your local Game Warden.
 - Call your Healthcare Provider
 - Call your local Animal Control Officer
 - Rabies testing is needed on the wild animal to rule out rabies.

Your Pet has been exposed to a...

Domestic animal (cat or dog)

- Call your local Animal Control Officer
- Call your Veterinarian
- If fully vaccinated, the cat or dog will likely require a 45 day observation period to rule out rabies.
- Call your local Animal Control Officer
- *Wild animal* (raccoon, skunk, bat, fox, or other wild animal)
 - Call your local Game Warden
 - Call your Veterinarian
 - Rabies testing is needed on the wild animal to rule out rabies
 - Call your local Animal Control Officer

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE SIDNEY ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION

The past year has been very busy for the Sidney Athletic Association. The participation numbers of our youth programs are consistent with last year in all sports. The Board currently consists of Jason Brann (President), Boyd Snowden (Vice-President), Bob Dube (Treasurer), Vicki Roy (Secretary), Keith McGlaufflin, Mark Larsen, Dean Hall and Brian Lambert.

Last year saw the completion of Phase 1 of the Field Development Project. The Town of Sidney now has 3 ball fields with a public restroom, an updated concessions stand and tons of parking. We've also added bleachers and fence cap and our facility is now one of the finest in Central Maine! In addition to the athletics fields there is now a walking trail and work has begun on some picnic spots along the river.

Our soccer program was hugely successful this year with 140 participants and 21 volunteer coaches. This program effectively represented half of the Messalonskee area soccer enrollment! Soccer continues to be a popular sport and with the help of our volunteer coaches we hope to continue adding to this program.

There is an ever-growing number of athletic opportunities for our youth. The field hockey program has continued to serve participants from Sidney as well as the lacrosse program. While these programs are not provided by or run by the Sidney Athletic Association we do support them in offering activities for the Town's youth. The basketball program runs under the guidance of Eric Seekins and the Messalonskee Youth Basketball Association (MYBA), while football and cheering programs are offered through Messalonskee Youth Football. Participant numbers for baseball, softball and T-ball programs were 165 players with 38 volunteer coaches. 2010 saw Cindy and Shawn Wilkie in their final year of running the Messalonskee Cal Ripken league. The Wilkie's worked with Mid-Maine softball as well to develop a game schedule for both sports for all three towns. Thanks to their efforts the youth of our area have had many years of well coordinated spring sports activities!

The adult volleyball program, coordinated by Jason Hargrove, is now in its fifth year at the Bean School gym. Volleyball is played on Sunday nights from early December through April. We encourage and invite all Sidney residents that wish to play to join us at the Bean School from 5:30– 8 PM on Sunday nights.

Those involved in SAA are very proud of our organization and the time we spend volunteering for the benefit of our youth and community. Sandy River Recycling Association **Report for 2010**

The Member Towns of the Sandy River Recycling Assoc. (SRRA) recycled 1,282.9 tons of material an increase of 80.8 tons from 2009.

The price for most recycled materials has remained fairly strong in the last three - quarters of 2010. We received \$126,479. in revenue from the sale of recyclables this year, an increase of \$65,376. from 2009. Even with the increase in revenue and the reduction of our budget by 8.95% , the Directors thought it prudent to increase the cost per ton from \$45. to \$52. per ton, an increase of \$7. per ton. This fee includes transportation and processing of recyclables and is well below the cost of disposal of municipal solid waste.

Operating costs for 2010 were \$223,037. this was \$5,763. under a budget of \$228,800. We also expended \$14,774. from our capital reserve for repair of containers and to cover the loss of revenue from last year.

We received 36.4 tons of food scraps for composting this year from Aramark (UMF) and the Mallett School and sold about \$250 worth of compost to area residents this past year. We are currently looking into expanding the compost project to other area schools.

Our web site up is and running at www.sandyriverrecycling.org . Please log on and take a look. The site is very informative and we hope will give people tips on recycling and answers to questions they may have. There are also links to other sites that people may find informative and interesting.

The Kennebec County Sheriff's Office continues to proudly serve the citizens of Kennebec County. The Sheriff's Office has a long history of service, dating back to 1799. Our agency provides a multitude of services, including Law Enforcement, Corrections, Court Security and Civil Service.

In 2010, Deputy Sheriffs responded to 28,776 calls for service. We answered 400 calls for service involving theft; 1,296 motor vehicle accidents; 237 burglaries and 128 K-9 calls. We also managed, on average, 180 registered sex offenders.

During the past year, our Correctional Facility managed 3,725 inmates. The offenses committed by defendants include everything from Burglaries to Homicides. Substance abuse and the proper treatment of citizens with mental illness continue to be two primary concerns at the Correctional Facility. The Criminogenic Addiction Recovery Academy was created this year to provide treatment for both substance abuse and mental illness. We cannot arrest our way out of the growing opiate addiction problem.

Inmates at the Kennebec County Correctional Facility are required to work. Throughout 2010, inmates worked 72, 941 community service hours, valued at approximately \$547,057. Inmates that are considered to be a risk to the Community, work inside the facility cleaning and cooking, others are supervised on outside projects. Our inmates raised 28,000 pounds of produce for the inmate kitchen and area food pantries in 2010. Beginning last year, inmates provided enhanced sanitation at many schools, reducing our students' exposure to the H1N1 virus.

I am committed to providing innovative programs to reduce crimes, assist victims and to provide enhanced public safety. I acknowledge the ever-growing opiate addiction problem and have committed to partnerships at the Federal, State and Local levels to combat this problem. Our approach is aggressive enforcement, education and treatment for those afflicted.

I am committed to providing the 122,000 citizens of Kennebec County with progressive and professional Law Enforcement and Correctional Services. I welcome any comments or suggestions, which improve our service to the citizens of Kennebec County.

Dear Citizens of the Town of Sidney:

It is hard to believe that we are already looking to the end of 2010. RSU 18, now in its second year of operation and the consolidation of the former MSAD 47 and China, is moving along nicely. I wanted to use this opportunity to write to you to speak about some of the major activities that have occurred in our system this past year. When I arrived here last July, I knew of the solid reputation of the MSAD 47 school system and was familiar with China's very good system as well. In this past year, I have seen the synergy of this combination that these two good systems have created and know that we are seeing the formation of something very good here.

You have elected a very capable and dedicated Board of Directors that serve the students, families and residents of Belgrade, China, Oakland, Rome, and Sidney. They do a wonderful job, and if you are out and about and happen to see them, please remember to thank them for their many hours of service on your behalf.

We have been continually working since my arrival here on ways to deal with the reality of a projected loss of \$2-3 million in educational revenues to the District. These revenue losses began in the 2008-09 budget year and will continue at least through the 2012-13 budget years. As I write this letter, we are preparing for what many have called, "the Funding Cliff" where we are projected to lose up to \$1.7 million in school subsidy this coming budget year. Continued work with the Board, Administration, and Staff, has led to many strategies to help us deal with this loss of revenues, but it is definitely not business as usual. With difficult choices and hard work by many, we will get through these times. Please stay involved in the budget development process and provide input on next year's budget.

An exciting piece of work accomplished this past year, was establishing the direction for RSU 18. This work occurred throughout the year and culminated this past March as a group of 80 stakeholders representing all segments of the RSU 18 community came together to develop a shared vision for our schools! This work led to the development (and adoption by the Board) of RSU 18's Mission, Vision and Core Beliefs and Values. If you would like a copy, please contact our office (465-7384, ext. 2656), and we will get a copy to you. We have begun and will be continuing to communicate this vision to all stakeholders of the RSU18 communities. The next step in this work is the development of the School District's Strategic Plan that will guide our efforts over the next five to ten years in order to make our education system work for each and every student.


This past year, two subcommittees (of the Board) were formed. Both committees were made up of residents from each of the District's communities. The first committee was the Cost Sharing Committee and the other was the Major Capital Application Committee. The charge to the Cost Sharing Committee was to develop a cost sharing formula for how the District towns will share the additional local funds component of the school district's revenue budget. This amounts to roughly five percent of school revenues, and the proposed cost sharing formula will be presented in each community this spring.

"Proudly serving the children in the Belgrade and China Lakes Regions."

The next step will be a public vote by RSU 18 residents in order to approve this cost sharing formula. If approved, this cost sharing formula would start in the budget year beginning, July 1, 2012. The other committee, the Major Capital Application Committee developed recommendations (to the Board) on which schools should warrant submitting an application to the State for replacement. This work resulted in an application being submitted for a plan that would combine the two China Schools into one school. We should hear how this application rated (vs. other Maine schools) next summer. This group also helped to complete a RSU 18 Facility Master Plan that has taken a look at all of our school facility needs over the next ten plus years. If anyone would like to see this plan, please contact our office.

As I said in the beginning, it has been a busy year. It was nice to take a step back and look at this past year. Have we accomplished all that we needed to? No, but we have made some very good progress on the necessary work that will help make RSU 18 one of the best school districts in the State of Maine. If you have time, please stop by to tell me your perspective on our schools and how we are doing. Thanks for the opportunity to serve you.

1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The Town of Sidney was incorporated in 1792 under the laws of the State of Massachusetts. The Town operates under the Board of Selectmen/Town Meeting form of government.

The Town's financial statements are prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP). The Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) is responsible for establishing GAAP for state and local governments through its pronouncements (Statements and Interpretations). Governments are also required to follow the pronouncements of the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) issued through November, 1989 (when applicable) that do not conflict with or contradict GASB pronouncements. Although the Town has the option to apply FASB pronouncements issued after that date to its business-type activities and enterprise funds, the Town has chosen not to do so. The more significant accounting policies established in GAAP and used by the Town are discussed below.

A. Reporting Entity

In evaluating how to define the reporting entity, for financial reporting purposes, management has considered all potential component units. The decision to include a potential component unit is made by applying the criteria set forth in GAAP which defines the reporting entity as the primary government and those component units for which the primary government is financially accountable. Financial accountability is defined as appointment of a voting majority of the component unit's board, and either a) the ability to impose will by the primary government, or b) the possibility that the component unit will provide a financial benefit to or impose a financial burden on the primary government. Application of this criterion and determination of type of presentation involves considering whether the activity benefits the government and/or its citizens, or whether the activity is conducted within the geographic boundaries of the government and is generally available to its citizens. Based upon the application of these criteria, there were no potential component units required to be included in this report.

B. Government-wide Financial Statements

The government-wide financial statements (i.e., the statement of net assets and the statement of changes in net assets) report information on all of the non fiduciary activities of the Town. For the most part, the effect of interfund activity has been removed from these statements. Governmental activities, which normally are supported by taxes and intergovernmental revenues, are reported separately from business-type activities, which rely to a significant extent on fees and charges for support.

The statement of activities demonstrates the degree to which the direct expenses of a given function or segment are offset

1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies, continued

by program revenues. Direct expenses are those that are clearly identifiable with a specific function or segment. The Town has elected not to allocate indirect costs among the programs, functions and segments. Program revenues include 1) charges to customers or applicants who purchase, use, or directly benefit from goods, services, or privileges provided by a given function or segment and 2) grants and contributions that are restricted to meeting the operational or capital requirements of a particular function or segment. Taxes and other items not properly included among program revenues are reported instead as general revenues.

Separate financial statements are provided for governmental funds and fiduciary funds, even though the latter is excluded from the government-wide financial statements. Major individual governmental funds are reported as separate columns in the fund financial statements.

C. Measurement Focus, Basis of Accounting, and Financial Statement Presentation

The government-wide financial statements are reported using the economic resources measurement focus and the accrual basis of accounting, as are the fiduciary fund financial statements. Revenues are recorded when earned and expenses are recorded when a liability is incurred, regardless of the timing of related cash flows. Property taxes are recognized as revenues in the year for which they are levied. Grants and similar items are recognized as revenues as soon as all eligibility requirements imposed by the provider have been met.

Governmental fund financial statements are reported using the current financial resources measurement focus and the modified accrual basis of accounting. Revenues are recognized as soon as they are both measurable and available. Revenues are considered to be available when they are collectible within the current period or soon enough thereafter to pay liabilities of the current period. For this purpose, the government considers revenues to be available if they are collected within 60 days of the end of the current fiscal period. Expenditures generally are recorded when a liability is incurred, as under accrual accounting. However, debt service expenditures, as well as expenditures related to compensated absences and claims and judgments, are recorded only when payment is due.

Licenses, permits, fees, excise taxes and miscellaneous revenues are recorded as revenues when received in cash because they are generally not measurable until actually received. Interest income and charges for services are recorded as revenues when earned, since they are measurable and available.

Those revenues susceptible to accrual are property taxes, interest, and charges for services. Other receipts and taxes become measurable and available when cash is received by the Town and are recognized as revenue at that time.

Entitlements and shared revenues are recorded at the time of receipt or earlier if the susceptible to accrual criteria are

1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies, continued

met. Expenditure-driven grants are recognized as revenue when the qualifying expenditures have been incurred and all other grant requirements have been met.

When both restricted and unrestricted resources are available for use, it is the Town's policy to use restricted resources first, then unrestricted resources as needed.

The Town reports the following major governmental fund:

The General Fund is the Town's primary operating fund. It accounts for all financial resources of the general government, except those required to be accounted for in another fund.

Additionally, the Town reports the following fund types:

Fiduciary Funds

Fiduciary funds are used to account for assets held by the Town in a trustee capacity or as an agent for individuals, private organizations, other governmental units, and/or other funds.

Private-purpose trust funds are used to report trust arrangements under which principal and income benefit individuals, private organizations, or other governments.

Private-sector standards of accounting and financial reporting issued prior to December 1, 1989, generally are followed in the government-wide financial statements to the extent that those standards do not conflict with or contradict guidance of the Governmental Accounting Standards Board. The government has elected not to follow subsequent private-sector guidance.

As a general rule the effect of interfund activity has been eliminated from the government-wide financial statements.

Amounts reported as program revenues include 1) charges to customers or applicants for goods, services, or privileges provided, 2) operating grants and contributions, and 3) capital grants and contributions, including special assessments. Internally dedicated resources are reported as general revenues rather than as program revenues. Likewise, general revenues include all taxes.

D. Capital Assets

Capital assets, which include property, plant, and equipment are reported in the governmental activities column in the government-wide financial statements. Capital assets are defined by the government as assets with an initial, individual cost of more than \$5,000 (amount not rounded) and an estimated useful life in excess of two years. Such assets are recorded at historical costs or estimated historical cost if purchased or constructed. Donated capital assets are recorded at estimated fair market value at the date of donation.

1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies, continued

The costs of normal maintenance and repairs that do not add to the value of the asset or materially extend assets lives are not capitalized. Major outlays for capital assets and improvements are capitalized as projects are constructed. Property, plant, and equipment of the primary government is depreciated using the straight line method over the following estimated useful lives ranging from 3 to 50 years.

E. Long-term Obligations

In the government-wide financial statements, long-term debt and other long-term obligations are reported as liabilities in the governmental activities statement of net assets. Bond premiums and discounts, as well as issuance costs, if material, are deferred and amortized over the life of the bonds using the effective interest method. Bonds payable are reported net of the applicable bond premium or discount. Bond issuance costs, if material, are reported as deferred charges and amortized over the term of the related debt.

In the fund financial statements, governmental fund types recognize bond premiums and discounts, as well as bond issuance costs, during the current period. The face amount of debt issued is reported as other financing sources. Premiums received on debt issuance are reported as other financing sources while discounts on debt issuance are reported as other financing uses. Issuance costs, whether or not withheld from the actual debt proceeds received, are reported as debt service expenditures.

F. Fund Equity

Reserved fund balance indicates that a portion of the fund balance is legally or otherwise segregated for a specific future use, and is indicated by the title of each reserve listed in the balance sheet. Unreserved-designated fund balances indicate amounts which either are required to be carried forward by law or contractual agreement, or which the Town has voted to carry forward.

G. Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

3. Deposits and Investments

A. Deposits

At year end, the Town's carrying amount of deposits was \$1,646,025. The bank balances for all funds totaled \$1,712,169. Custodial credit risk is the risk that, in the event of a bank failure the Town's deposits might not be

recovered. As of January 31, 2010, all of the Town's deposits were insured or collateralized.

5. Property Tax

Property taxes for the year were committed on July 27, 2009, on the assessed value listed as of April 1, 2009, for all taxable real and personal property located in the Town. Payment of taxes was due September 1, 2009 with interest at 9.00% on all tax bills unpaid as of September 1, 2009. Assessed values are periodically established by the Town's Assessor at 100% of assumed market value. The assessed value for the list of April 1, 2009 upon which the levy for the year ended January 31, 2010, was based, was \$331,019,033. This assessed value was 100% of the estimated market value.

5. Property Tax, continued

Tax liens are placed on real property within twelve months following the tax commitment date if taxes are delinquent. The Town has the authority to foreclose on property eighteen months after the filing of the lien if tax liens and associated costs remain unpaid.

Property taxes levied during the year were recorded as receivables at the time the levy was made. The receivables collected during the year and in the first sixty days following the end of the fiscal year have been recorded as revenues. The remaining receivables have been recorded as deferred revenues.

10. Statutory Debt Limits

In accordance with 30 MRSA, Section 5061, as amended, no municipality shall incur debt for specified purposes in excess of 15 percent of the state valuation of such municipality. At January 31, 2010, the Town was in compliance with these regulations.

12. Risk Management

The Town of Sidney is exposed to various risks of losses related to torts; theft of, damage to, and destruction of assets; errors and omissions; injuries to employees; and natural disasters. The Town maintains insurance coverage for part of its risk management. Expenditures and claims are recognized when it is probable that a loss has occurred and the amount of the loss can be reasonably estimated. In determining claims, events that might create claims, but for which none have been reported, are considered. The Town's management estimates that the amount of actual or potential claims against the Town as of January 31, 2010, will not materially affect the financial condition of the Town.

Sec. 1011-1046 ("Cruelty to Animals") or has been adjudicated liable for a civil violation for cruelty to animals under Title 7 M.R.S.A. Sec. 4011-4017. State law requires an ACO to complete training and be certified by the Commissioner of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources within six months of appointment, by following the procedure outlined in Title 7 M.R.S.A. Sec. 3906-B(4). ACOs must attend advanced training courses in order to maintain certification. Upon appointment of an ACO, the municipal clerk will notify the Commissioner of the name, address, and telephone number of the ACO.

ARTICLE 42: To see if the Town will vote to amend the Administrative Ordinance, III. Permits, F. Conditions, #1 or take any action thereon.

1. Permits and/or approvals granted under this Section may be made subject to reasonable conditions directly supported by the standards of review in the Ordinances governing the proposed use to ensure conformity with the purposes of the Ordinances.

Conditions stated on the permit shall be accompanied by the pertinent Ordinance(s).

ARTICLE 43: To see if the Town will vote to accept the rewrite to the Ordinance Governing the Planning Board to take any action thereon. (See Addendum A)

ARTICLE 44: To see if the Town will vote to amend the Sidney Ordinance Governing the Board of Appeals, Sec. I. Establishment and Organization, or take any action thereon::

A. A Board of Appeals is hereby established which shall consist of five (5) members and two (2) alternates. The term of office of ~~all~~ **for** members **and alternates** is three (3) years, serving staggering terms. Neither a municipal officer nor his/her spouse may be a member of the Board of Appeals. Members of the Board of Appeals shall be appointed by the Municipal Officers. When there is a permanent vacancy, the Municipal Officers shall appoint a new member for the remainder of the unexpired term. Members of the Board of Appeals may be removed from office by the Municipal Officers for cause upon written charges and after hearing. ~~The Board of Appeals shall elect a chairperson and secretary from its own membership.~~

B. The Board of Appeals shall elect a chairperson and secretary from its own membership. The Board secretary shall keep minutes of all meetings of the Board and a record of all resolutions, transactions, correspondence, findings and determinations. A copy of the minutes of the board meetings shall be filed with the Town Clerk as a permanent and official record. All board records shall be deemed to be public information.

ARTICLE 45: To see if the Town will vote to amend the Sidney Ordinance Governing the Board of Appeals, III. Power and Duties of the Board of Appeals, or take any action thereon

1. Administrative Review. To hear and decide **administrative** appeals **on a de novo basis**, where it is alleged **by an aggrieved party that** there is an error in any administrative decision, order, requirement or determination made by, **or failure to act by**, the Code Enforcement Officer or Planning Board **in the administration of this Ordinance, except for a decision of the Planning Board relative to a subdivision application, which shall be appealable directly to Superior Court. A de novo review looks at the factual and legal issues, afresh, undertakes its own credibility determinations, evaluates the evidence presented, and draws its own conclusions.** Following such a hearing, the Board of Appeals may reverse the decision of the Code Enforcement Officer or Planning Board only upon finding that the decision is clearly contrary to the specific provision of the Ordinance.

ARTICLE 46: To see if the Town will vote to amend the Sidney Ordinance Governing the Board of Appeals, V. Appeal Procedure, A. Making an Appeal or take any action thereon

6. The Board of Appeals shall hold a public hearing on the appeal within 60 days of its receipt of an appeal application. Notice of the date, time, and place of the hearing shall be placed in newspapers of general circulation in the area at least 7 days prior to the hearing. **The applicant will pay the** cost of the publication, with a minimum of \$150 paid in advance **of the hearing. Publication costs in excess of the initial fee will be charged to the applicant. All costs** to be born as follows:

a. If the appeal is made by an abutter of the project under review, or any other member of the public, cost of the publication of the notice shall be borne by the person(s) making the appeal.

b. If the appeal is made by the applicant of the project under review, that applicant shall bear the cost of publication of the notice.

7. The Board of Appeals ~~applicant of the project under review~~ shall also provide written notice of the appeal to all abutting landowners.

ARTICLE 47: To see if the Town will vote to amend the Sidney Ordinance Governing the Board of Appeals, V. Appeal Procedure, C. Decisions of the Board of Appeals or take any action thereon.

1. A majority of the members of the Board shall constitute a quorum for the purposes of ~~deciding an appeal~~ **conducting an official meeting**. A member who abstains shall not be counted in determining whether a quorum exists.

ARTICLE 48: To see if the Town will vote to amend the Sidney Zoning Ordinances, Sec. VI., Performance Standards, Letter O. Signs to include :

7. Changeable message signs, including time and temperature signs, are permitted under this subsection provided that each message remains fixed on the display surface for a minimum of two (2) seconds. For purposes of this subsection, "changeable message signs" are signs whose messages change by mechanical or electronic means. Freestanding changeable message signs may include message boards where letters, words, pictures and messages can be removed and replaced, provided that the signs are permanently mounted

within a fixed base. Changeable message signs may also be affixed to a building. Scrolling and other effects that make the message appear to have movement, or that have a continuous streaming of information and animation are not permitted.

ARTICLE 49: To see if the Town will vote to amend the Sidney Zoning Ordinances, Sec. VI., Performance Standards, Letter Q. Standards for the Construction in Town Right of Ways, # 5 to read:

5. New private drives leading from a Town Right of Way shall be inspected by the Town Road Commissioner, upon receipt of application, to determine whether there is a necessity of placing a culvert. The Town Road Commissioner shall make the determination as to whether a culvert needs to be placed, the size of such culvert, and the appropriate placement of such culvert. The culvert shall be a minimum of 12" in diameter and be of aluminized metal or heavy ribbed plastic with smooth bore. ~~The Town shall place the culvert and cover the culvert.~~ The initial purchase of the culvert shall be the responsibility of the land owner.

ARTICLE 50: To see if the Town will vote to accept the Moratorium Ordinance on Sexually Oriented Businesses or take any action thereon: *(See Addendum B)*

ARTICLE 51: To see if the Town will vote to amend the Sidney Ordinance Part II, Flood Plain Management Ordinance as required by the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968 (P.L. 90-488, as amended), or take any other action thereon. *(See Addendum C)*

ARTICLE 52: To see if the Town will vote to increase the property tax levy limit of \$61,635 established for Sidney by State law in the event that the municipal budget approved under the preceding articles will result in a tax commitment that is greater than that property tax levy limit.

ARTICLE 53: To see what action the Town wishes to take regarding the release of funds returned by the State of Maine from snowmobile registration fees.



Definitions of Terms

The following are definitions of terms are used in this manual:

1. **Abatement:** A reduction of assessed property taxes, if it is deemed that an error was made in the original assessment of the said property.
2. **Accrual:** This is money that was appropriated at Town Meeting for a specific expense or project that is not completed before the end of the year. Money left over is carried forward to finish the project in the next fiscal year.
3. **Block Grant:** Is funds received from the State to compensate towns for winter plowing of State roads.
4. **Borrow:** A loan to fund large ticket capital improvement items such as vehicles, new buildings or improvements to existing buildings, etc.
5. **Contingency Fund:** Money that can be used only for unbudgeted emergency use.
6. **Escrow:** Money that was approved to be set aside for future use for a specific item or purpose. Voters must approve the use of escrow money.
7. **Overlay:** Monies that are appropriated at commitment time to cover errors in property assessments through an abatement process. Overlay amounts are determined by a formula set up by the State.
8. **Raise:** Funds that are appropriated through the mil rate, to fund expenses such as education, County, overlay, the Kennebec Regional Development Authority and items voted on at the Town Meeting that are not appropriated through the surplus.
9. **Receipts:** Income received, such as interest or donations that can be utilized to cover a shortage in a specific account. If not used, it will be placed into the reserve account for that department or will be rolled over into surplus.
10. **Surplus:** Money left over at the end of the Fiscal Year. It consists of collected excise tax, fees, undesignated receipts, and unexpended money. Surplus reduces the amount money to be raised to cover the approved budget. Rather than using projected receipts like the State of Maine and other municipalities, we use only collected receipts to help keep our budget in check.
